WEEK out from Angeline Andrews' opening night at the Fringe Festival, one of her play's two main characters was stolen.

Andrews moved to New Zealand from Britain on a working holiday in December with plans to bring her one-woman show, *Typeface*, to the Fringe Bar for the Fringe Festival.

The play stars Andrews as a lonely office worker who steals her fellow workers' computer fonts. "She figures everyone is far more interesting than she is."

The computer is the only other character in the play, projecting images on to a screen, commenting on Andrews' character.

A problem arose, however, after someone broke into her house near The Terrace a week ago and stole the computer, along with another laptop, cellphones and passports.

She was still unsure about whether the theft was covered by insurance.




Typeface, a
